

**Troparion of the Resurrection (Tone 8):** From the heights Thou didst descend, O compassionate one. And Thou didst submit to the three-day burial, that Thou might deliver us from passion. Thou art our life and our resurrection; O Lord, glory to Thee!

Troparion for St. James, Son of Alphaeus (Tone 3): O holy apostle James, intercede with the merciful God to grant to our souls forgiveness of sins.

Kontakion to the Theotokos (Tone 2): O undisputed intercessor of Christians, O Theotokos who is unrejected by the Creator: Turn not away from the voice of our petitions, though we be sinners. Come to us with aid in time, who cry unto thee in faith, for thou art good. Hasten to us with intercessions, O Theotokos, who didst ever intercede for those who honor thee.

**Troparion of All Saints (Tone 4):** Adorned in the blood of Thy martyrs, throughout all the world as in purple and fine linen, Thy Church through them doth cry unto Thee, O Christ God: Send down Thy compassion upon Thy people! Grant peace to Thy habitation and great mercy to our souls.



### THE EPISTLE

For the Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

Make your vows to the Lord our God and perform them. God is known in Judah; His Name is great in Israel.

## The Reading from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians (6:14-7:1)

Brethren, do not be mismated with unbelievers. For what partnership have righteousness and iniquity? Or what fellowship has light with darkness? What accord has Christ with Belial? Or what has a believer in common with an unbeliever? What agreement has the temple of God with idols?

For we are the temple of the living God; as God said:

"I will live in them and move among them, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Therefore, come out from them, and be separate from them," says the Lord, "and touch nothing unclean; then I will welcome you, and I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, and make holiness perfect in the fear of God.

### THE GOSPEL

For the Third Sunday of Luke

## The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke (7:11-16)

At that time, Jesus went to a city called Nain, and many of His disciples and a great crowd went with Him. As He drew near to the gate of the city, behold, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow; and a large crowd from the city was with her. And when the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep." And He came and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. And Jesus said, "Young man, I say to you: arise." And the dead man sat up, and began to speak. And Jesus gave him to his mother. Fear seized them all; and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us!" and "God has visited His people!"

**THE HOLY APOSTLE JAMES, THE SON OF ALPHAEUS** is mentioned four times in the New Testament as one of the Twelve (Matthew 10:3, Mark 3:18, Luke 6:15, Acts 1:13). In each of these lists, he is grouped together with Jude Thaddeus, Simon the Zealot, and (in the three Gospels) Judas Iscariot, perhaps indicating a common history as zealot revolutionaries before meeting the Lord.

St. Matthew is also called "Levi, the son of Alphaeus" (Mark 2:14), thus the obvious tradition that the two are brothers. One can only imagine the difficulties in the family with one brother a tax collector and the other a zealot! Yet together they embraced the Kingdom of Heaven, greater than all earthly kingdoms and philosophies.

He is often identified with "James the Younger" (or James the Less), son of a woman

named Mary (not the Theotokos) who followed Jesus and who was present at the crucifixion (Matthew 27:56, Mark 15:40, Mark 16:1). The other Apostle James – the son of Zebedee – is known as "James the Greater," perhaps because of his stature, or simply because he was the older of the two. (It is not difficult to understand why two apostles with the same name would need nicknames to distinguish them!)

James is also said to have preached the Gospel in Judea, Edessa, Gaza, Eleutheropolis, and Egypt, where he was crucified by pagans.
