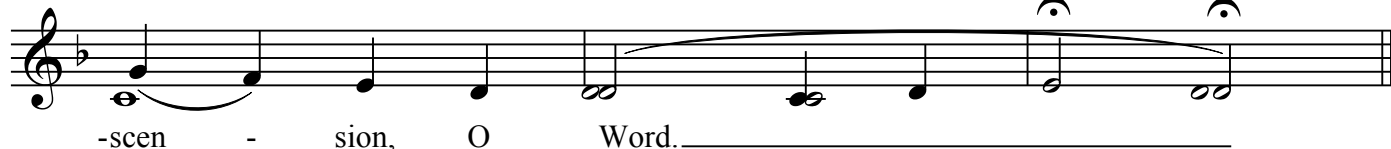
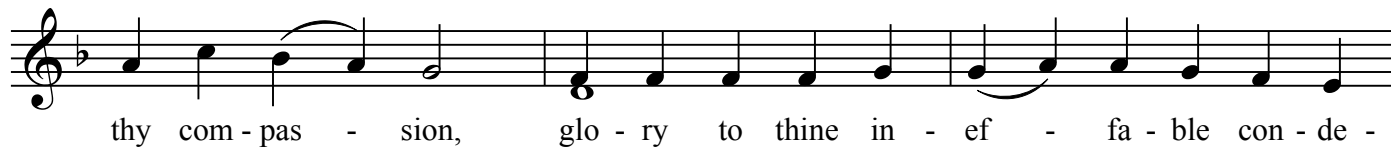
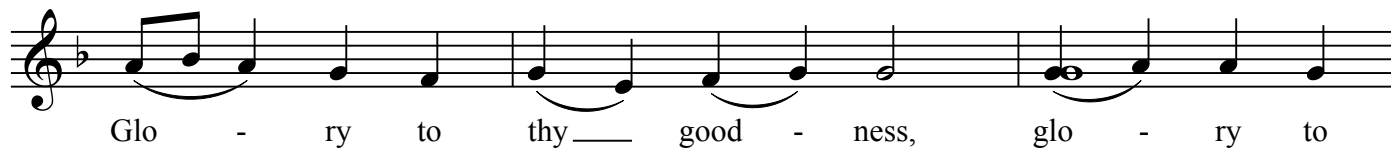
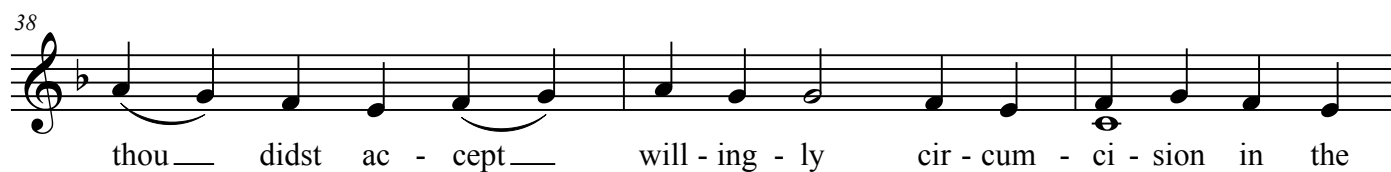
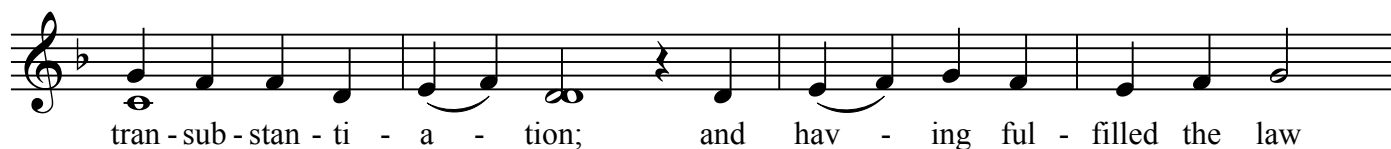
V. 1: Let the Heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice. Sing unto the Lord; chant unto His name. (Ps. 95 :2) R.
