Troparion of the Resurrection (Tone 7): Thou didst shatter death by Thy cross, Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment-bearing women into joy. And didst bid Thine apostles proclaim a warning, that Thou hast risen O Christ, granting to the world the great mercy.

Troparion for the Holy Cross (Tone 1): O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance. Grant victories to the Orthodox Christians over their adversaries. And by the virtue of Thy cross, preserve Thine habitation.

Kontakion to the Theotokos for the Sundays of Lent (Tone 8): O Champion Leader, to thee I offer thanks of victory! O Theotokos, thou hast delivered me from terror. As thou hast invincible power, O Theotokos, thou truly can set me free from all danger. Set me free and deliver me, that I may cry unto thee: Hail, O bride without bridegroom!

Troparion of All Saints (Tone 4): Adorned in the blood of Thy martyrs, throughout all the world as in purple and fine linen, Thy Church through them doth cry unto Thee, O Christ God: Send down Thy compassion upon Thy people; grant peace to Thy habitation and great mercy to our souls.

THE EPISTLE

For the Third Sunday of Lent

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance.
Unto Thee, O Lord, will I cry, O my God!
The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews (4:14-5:6)

Brethren, since we have a great High Priest, who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast the confession. For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize with our infirmities, but one who has been in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore draw near with boldness to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy, and may find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest, being taken from among the people, is appointed on behalf of the people in things pertaining to God, that he may offer up both gifts and sacrifices for sins; who can have compassion on the ignorant and on those who are erring, since he himself also is encompassed with infirmity. Because of this he is bound, as for the people so also for



himself, to offer up for sins. And no one takes the honor upon himself, but as being called by God, as was Aaron. So Christ also did not glorify Himself to become a High Priest, but it was by the one saying to Him, "Thou art My Son, today I have begotten Thee." As He says also in another place, "Thou art a Priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

For the Third Sunday of Lent

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark (8:34-9:1)

The Lord said, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will

lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And Jesus said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

This Sunday, March 19, is the ninth anniversary of the repose of Sayedna PHILIP of thrice-blessed memory. He ministered as its chief shepherd for 48 years, working tirelessly and

continually as a dedicated hierarch in the service of his Archdiocese as well as the Antiochian Patriarchate. He strived to heal the then-existing fractures and divisions between Antiochians in this land and succeeded admirably. After these divisions had been healed, he concentrated his efforts on further strengthening the archdiocese and expanding it. During his tenure, he increased the number of its parishes from 65 to 262. He strived to spread the Orthodox Faith beyond the existing ethnic boundaries and inaugurated an epoch of Orthodox evangelism in North America, by communicating with other faithful Christians and welcoming them into the Antiochian Church.

Let us pray today to our God, who is good and loves mankind, that our father Metropolitan PHILIP may now enjoy the unfading splendor of His heavenly kingdom.

For the most part, our readings for Lent come from five books of the Bible: Genesis, Isaiah, & Proverbs from the Old Testament (one book from each section of the Hebrew canon); Hebrews & Mark from the New. If you have fallen out of the habit of daily Scripture reading, there is no time better than Lent to start!
